

The TRIIALproject (BRV)

The TRIIAL project, for which Lectoraat Multilevel Regulation was a co-applicant, was awarded funding from the European Commission (Horizon 2020). Quoting from the project proposal:

"TRIIAL provides training activities and tools for judges, lawyers, arbitrators and other legal professionals in areas of salient importance for the application of the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights: trust, independence, impartiality, accountability of judges and arbitrators. Its main objective is to explain and disseminate knowledge of the CFR potential for ensuring and improving the fundamental rights standards, ultimately benefiting the rule of law in the Member States."

This project is conducted within a broad international consortium. The partners include the main applicant, the Centre of Judicial Cooperation of the European University Institute, and 12 co-beneficiaries: 2 Judicial Schools (the Italian School for the Judiciary and the Belgian Judicial School); the National Association of the Romanian Bars; 8 academic institutions (Universities of: Barcelona-Pompeu Fabra, Eötvös Loránd, Florence, Gdansk, Ljubljana, Maastricht, Centre for Research in Public Law of the Lisbon University, THUAS), and a Polish think tank (INPRIS).

As part of the project (and among other educational and training activities), the lectoraat MLR Regulation will organise training for arbitrators on the Charter of Fundamental Rights. We are pleased to participate in this timely project that addresses the rule of law challenges in the EU!
